Georg Óskar's creative journey is a testament to the power of keen observation and introspection, offering a lens through which we can explore the intricacies of our

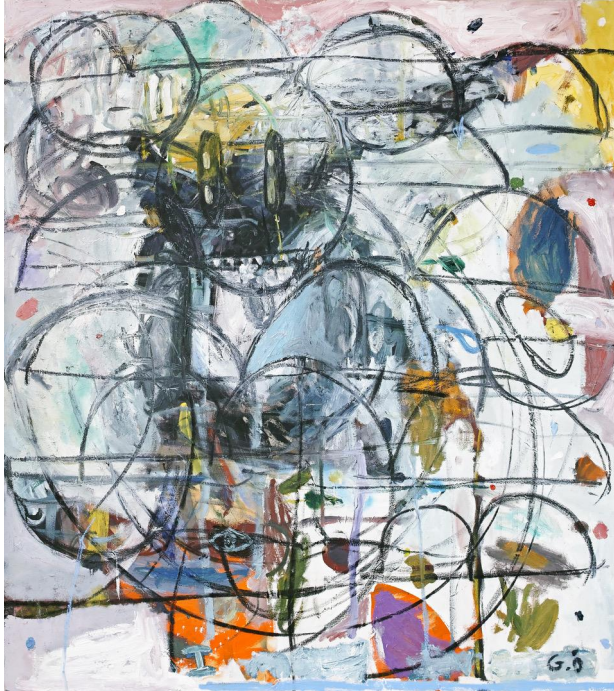
